This week we have been learning about our eyes. We enjoyed sharing the story 'Walking through the jungle' and spent some time writing our own version 'Walking through the playground'. The children have been busy using their eye sight for a variety of activities such as playing eye spy, searching 'Where's Wally' books and playing aiming games in PE. The children have also had the chance to use blindfolds to test out what it would be like to not be able to see. They've had to trust a partner to help them around obstacles! We have enjoyed using our role play opticians and exploring the investigation table where we have had fun using binoculars, magnifying glasses, kaleidoscopes and periscopes. Thank you for everything you have sent in to support us in our learning this week! In maths we have been working on addition. The children should be able to tell you what symbols are needed in an addition number sentence.

Letters and Sounds This week we have been working on learning to recognise and write the sounds g,o,c,k.
