Our children participate in the YST case study 'Our girls can' programme, which promotes physical activity. The Aspire MAT gives us the opportunity to develop and promote PE throughout the Trust Specialist sports teacher employed for 12 weeks to support and guide newly appointed Sports HLTA coach and mentor him.

The number of children able to attend sporting events has increased significantly as has the number of events attended due to us being able to facilitate them without cost of parental support. The school receives an annual external audit of Sports Equipment which identifies needs for improvement/renovation/replacement. The school regularly purchases sports equipment which is used for extra-curricular	



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activities/play activities led by the sports HLTA
during playtimes and lunch times
The school has continued to develop the range
of provision of afterschool clubs which
currently includes golf, rugby, football, yoga,
multi-skills, cross country, Netball and
basketball. The quality of provision offered and
use of external providers is subsidised.
