### Thank you for protecting learning!

As I mentioned last week, attendance will remain a focus throughout this year and we will strive to work hard with you to ensure no learning time is unnecessarily lost.

You might find this graphic useful.

If your child's attendance slips, over time, under 90%, that equates to 4 weeks of the school year—or over 90 hours— of lost learning!

In addition, when a child has missed learning, they will need additional adult support to get back up to speed, detracting attention from others.

Please do let us know if you need support in ensuring excellent attendance.
