Please don't forget that we will <u>always</u> need to know when your child is absent from school. If the absence is due to illness, please call the school 01208 862496 and use option 2 to leave a message. Please ensure that your message explains why they are absent, it is not satisfactory to just say "they are absent today". We need to code all absences on the register so we would need a little more information to be able to code correctly!

If your child has an appointment and will be either absent or late please call the office or email liz.hall@stminver.org in advance.

If you are taking your child out for an absence of more than half a day we will need a formal absence request form to be completed in advance of the absence period. Even if absence is classed as unauthorised it is our responsibility to know that all of our children are safe on every school day. If you choose to take them away without completing a form we will not know where they are and will then need to take further steps to ensure that they are safe! Please pay this by logging in to your Parent Pay account, any problems please pop into the office.


Please note that there will be NO after school Netball Club next Thursday (9/5/19) as it will clash with the Reception and KS1 Fun Run Challenge.
