Explorer extravaganza!

On Wednesday Class 6 were lucky to spend the day with Antony Jinman who has been on several polar expeditions. Born in Plymouth (like the explorer Robert Scott who we've read about that went to Antarctica) he was the 12th Briton to ski to both the north and south poles (doing this solo on his expedition to Antarctica!).

Antony showed the class some of the equipment he used on his journey to the poles, showed presentations and told us stories of life in these frozen lands, camping in a tent in temperatures as cold as -65 degrees C!

The class learnt about the wildlife at each pole with photos and videos of what Antony saw whilst exploring the far north and south. The children made 'gooey glaciers', investigated the effects of animal fat by making blubber gloves and planned their own polar expedition.
